ARCA Nominating Committee Proposes Slate & Supporting By-Laws Mod

A Nominating Committee consisting of Chick Walter (Chair), Katie Buck, Patty Joyce, Nancy Swain, Andrea Walker, Molly Watson, and Bud Wood was convened "for the purpose of preparing a slate of officers." Over the course of six weeks, this Committee has met three times and collaborated regularly via email, and, after careful consideration, makes the following recommendations.

First, this article will serve as due notice to the regular membership of ARCA that, at the July, 2011, meeting, the Nominating Committee will offer a motion to modify the by-laws to expand the Executive Committee. Current by-laws specify the Executive Committee as consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. After careful consideration and discussion, the Nominating Committee has determined that the needs of a thriving, transparent, and responsive neighborhood association require expanded participation. The Nominating Committee will therefore propose that the Executive Committee be expanded, and will propose an expanded slate to include the addition of Communications as a permanent member and expanding the Secretary role to include Parliamentarian. Also, recognizing the evolving priorities and workload of ARCA over time, each year the Nominating Committee will have the option to include on their proposed slate up to 2 additional VPs (one external and one internal) as well as up to three Ad Hoc members whose functions will be established and reviewed yearly based on most pressing neighborhood concerns. For this upcoming term, the committee would be composed of the following: President, two Vice Presidents for External Affairs, two Vice Presidents for Internal Affairs, Secretary & Parliamentarian, Treasurer, Communications, and two Ad Hoc positions -- Zoning & Development, and Transportation. Please refer to the www.arcaonline.org website for the exact wording of the proposed changes.

Second, at the July, 2011, meeting, the Nominating Committee will offer the following slate of neighbors who have agreed to take on the responsibilities, for a term of one year, of the Arlington Ridge Civic Association Executive Board:

County to Reconstruct Ridge Rd Intersections (S. 23rd, Oakcrest, and Meade Sts.) in August

County reconfiguration of the intersection of S. Arlington Ridge Rd, S. 23rd, Oakcrest, and Meade Sts. is scheduled to begin August 8th and take approximately 4 weeks. After two meetings on May 5th and May 19th, where area residents voiced many concerns, ARCA sent a letter requesting a hold on the redesign until neighbor concerns could be addressed. The June 29th County response contained some changes to the prior plan, but retained the redesign of S. Meade Street (a major concern of immediate neighbors). Subsequent meeting with Ms. Hynes on July 6 resulted in no additional changes. The ARCA letter and the final design can be viewed at www.arcaonline.org.

Update: Status of Special Planning Process for the PenPlace

As discussed in the Jan and March newsletters, Vornado Corporation is seeking nearly 1.9 million additional square feet of office space for Parcel 1D of the Pentagon City tract. The Vornado proposal would require modification to the General Land Use Plan (GLUP), the C-O 2.5 zoning for the area, the Phased Development Site Plan (PDSP) and the Master Development Plan. To assess this proposal, Arlington County tasked the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) of the Planning Commission to establish a framework for considering any possible changes to the Pentagon City PDSP. The purpose of the LRPC process is to 1) evaluate PDSP development currently approved for Parcel 1D in the context of nearby existing and approved development 2) To review previously established planning goals/policies for land use, transportation, and urban design for the parcel and 3) to develop guiding principles for Parcel 1D. The intent is to then use these "updated principles" (and

not the original 1979 Master Plan) to assess the Vornado proposal. Our ARCA reps (Chick Walter, Don Clark and Nancy Swain) have attended the 4 LRPC sessions held to date and have articulated that ARCA supports the original plan for Pentagon City, which does not allow for any more additional office development. Nevertheless, the goal of the July 21st session is to discuss and finalize the "updated" guiding principles for the site with the intention of eventually taking them forward to a work session with the County Board for approval. Neighborhood Conservation Plan (NCP) Update, including Park Enhancement Grants

The PEG program, ancillary to the NCP, provides grants up to \$15,000 for small, stand-alone capital improvement and beautification projects for County parks and recreation facilities. Our neighborhood sent three "letters of intent" for 2012 program--two from ARCA, one from Pentagon Ridge Condominium Association (PRCA).

The first ARCA letter proposes safety improvements to Ft. Scott Park to serve as a barrier for cars that breach the Park's curb such as the incident that resulted in the 2009 death of a neighbor walking on Ft. Scott Dr. The second ARCA proposal is to replace the grass at the I-395/S. Arlington Ridge Rd with low-maintenance liriope-- saving ARCA approximately \$450 per year in mowing costs and creating a more environmentally friendly and attractive entry to our neighborhood.

Update on the Crystal City Citizens Review Council (CCCRC)

The Crystal City Citizens Review Council, established by Arlington County, began meeting in April 2011. A second meeting occurred on June 1st. A site has been set up for the CCCRC. The Plan, plus other materials, can be found at http://www.arlingtonva.us/departments/Commissions /CrystalCityCRC/page81058.aspx.

At this point, the Council has reviewed the committee charge (comments by Mary Hynes) and received a high level summary of the Plan. In June, Dennis Leach provided an overview of the transportation components, the open space plan was reviewed and Vornado updated the Council on current The PRCA proposal would use the PEG grant to reverse the decline of Prospect Hill Park located at 1025 S. Arlington Ridge Road. The PEG process begins with a "letter of intent" that was due June 30, followed by a draft application due Aug 26 with a final application due Oct 14. Some financial support from ARCA for these projects would increase the likelihood of their approval as attracting funds from other sources is one of the review criteria. A commitment of \$450 (the equivalent of one-year's mowing) for the I395/Ridge Road intersection is suggested and will be voted on at the July 21st meeting.

Status of the NC Plan: Section summaries are being drafted for ARCA's NCP based on the survey results that were discussed in our March newsletter.

development plans (site plans for two structures are currently underway).

ARCA representatives are currently working to define metrics that should be implemented and evaluated on an on-going basis ensuring that impacts to our community are understood and effectively evaluated with particular focus on traffic (minimize cut-through), environmental (walkability & air quality), and public services (schools, libraries, community centers, urgent care, etc). Our work will continue through the summer and recommended metrics will be presented to the Council.

Arlington Public Schools (APS) Overcrowding

APS projects new school buildings and/or additions are needed to handle increased enrollment throughout the school system. APS staff asked PTAs for their opinion on ways to increase capacity as input for 2012 Capital Improvement Plan. After meetings in May/June and considering responses to the APS online questionnaire, the Oakridge PTA stated they would not support the permanent addition of 8-10 classrooms at our school. The community didn't support the concept of Oakridge becoming a "mega school". Oakridge capacity (550-581) is just below the county's preferred school size of 600. Current enrolment is 630; permanent additions that result in a larger population will strain our current infrastructure and have detrimental, long-term effects on our neighborhood. The community also overwhelmingly rejected the idea of increasing class sizes by 1-2 students because this type of increase puts a disproportionate burden already on large/ overcrowded schools while some schools are still well below capacity.
