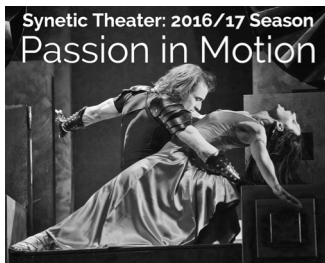

FUTURE DEVELOPMENT, DENSITY AND CONGESTION IN THE 22202 FORTRESS

For many years, Arlington County has viewed its "22202 Southern Triangle" as its *economic engine*. To that end, it has planned to add significant additional commercial and residential development in both Crystal and Pentagon Cities. Meanwhile, ARCA has been waving a cautionary flag given that thousands of additional commuters, residents and shoppers in 22202 could possibly overload our limited transportation infrastructure and create unbearable congestion.

At long last, the County has begun to recognize our unique geography given that we are surrounded by impenetrable walls: I-395 to the north and west, Four Mile Run along our southern boundary, and the railroad right-of-way along the eastern edge of Crystal City. Our two Metro stations are already among the most crowded in the County and there are only two, north/south roadways (Ridge Road and Jeff-Davis Hwy) that allow traffic to pass through 22202 – none from the east or west. (Take note: Alexandria has already begun planning to convert its adjoining Potomac Yard real estate into another Crystal City.)

In response to an ARCA Resolution, the County assembled this past year a massive quantity of historic, 22202 traffic and transit data which it recently posted on its website: <https://projects.arlingtonva.us/22202-data/>

ARCA has assembled its own task force to analyze that data and identify what additional information will be needed in order to predict the impact additional development envisioned by the County in its Crystal City Sector Plan could have on safety and quality of life in our walled-in fortress.

(Density, cont.)

That Plan calls for a doubling of the residential population in Crystal City, and a 60+ percent increase in its office space.

Further, hoping to assuage community concerns, County staff recently assembled a study of the 40-year evolution of the Pentagon City Phased Development Site Plan (PDSP) in an effort to show that the County had not, over the years, approved any increase in the level of development from that which had originally been approved in 1976. Immediately after its presentation at the Aurora Hills Community Center in late June, ARCA did its own analysis of the County's records which actually establish that the existing residential population of Pentagon City will nearly double in coming years, and its commercial, office density will eventually be three times what it is today, or as authorized in the 1976 PDSP.

Over the summer months, ARCA met individually with, and was well received by, each of the County Board Members. We shared with them and other officials our own density analysis (<http://www.arcaonline.org/2016/09/pentagon-city-density-evolution-1976-2016>) and urged them to authorize no new development in 22202 until completion of a more in-depth study to project potential levels of traffic/transit congestion in the years to come once all currently authorized development in our fortress – and to our south – has been constructed and occupied. In the meantime, we are searching for, and hope to partner with some university urban planning academics to conduct that study that will then enable strategic, or Smart Growth in 22202.

RIVER HOUSE NEWS FLASH!!

Vornado has just submitted to the County a new request to up-zone its 37-acre River House property to allow it to construct upwards of 1,000 new apartments on that property located within ARCA's neighborhood. Vornado's proposal is currently undergoing staff review for conformity with administrative regulations and will not be made publically available for several more weeks. ARCA will keep you informed as we learn more.

Arlington's AIRE (Arlington Initiative to Rethink Energy) team helps residents make smart

energy decisions that save money and leave a lighter footprint on the environment. At back to school time, they want us to know some energy fun facts...

Wakefield water is heated by the sun via solar thermal panels on its roof.

Discovery Elementary School is a Net Zero Energy school; it creates as much energy as it uses.

The earth heats and cools Discovery, Wakefield and Taylor schools using geothermal wells drilled hundreds of feet into the ground.

Thomas Jefferson Gym saves \$45,000 annually with its new LED lighting.

Arlington currently has 5 LEED certified schools. Many schools have **environmentally responsible "cool" roofs**, painted white or with added vegetation.

Stormwater at Wakefield is captured for irrigation and toilet flushing.

HORIZON HOUSE NEEDS AN ACCESSIBLE CROSSWALK!

Horizon House, located at 1300 Army Navy Drive, has been asking the County for some time to provide a pedestrian crosswalk at the bus stop in front of its building to accommodate a resident who must use a motorized wheel chair, and who commutes by bus. So far they have not been able to persuade the County to get out its pot of paint and stripe the roadway as they say that there would need to be extensive work done to the sidewalk on the west side of the road before they can proceed with an ADA compliant crosswalk. The County wants us to stay out of our cars, to walk as much as we can, and has provided bike lanes on many of our streets, but how about we prioritize access for the disabled on our sidewalks? When your means of locomotion is a wheel chair, you don't have too many options. ARCA will follow up on this issue, and hopefully the County can find funds for this important project.
