Please join us on Wed. November 18 when we have invited Erik Beach, Planning Supervisor for Arlington County's Dept. of Parks & Recreation to discuss the next phase of the **Long Bridge Park Project**; and we will also have updates on the **Four Mile Run Wetlands Rehabilitation Project**, **Vornado's River House Development initiative** and the **South Arlington Schools Selection Site**.

LONG BRIDGE PARK PROJECT

Long Bridge Park opened in 2011 with 3 athletic fields, an esplanade, rain gardens and picnic areas. The second phase of the County's master plan for the park calls for park expansion and construction of an Aquatic Health and Fitness Facility. Given the passage of years, the County has decided first to check in with the community to ensure it is still on track. They would like input on which amenities are most important to us, or if you do not believe the County should invest in the facility at all. This input will help guide staff and the Long Bridge Park Advisory Committee to provide input to the County Manager who will then make recommendations to the County Board. Suggested amenities include a 50m pool, diving tower, gym, teaching pool, iconic architecture and warm water pool for rehabilitation.

FOUR MILE RUN RESTORATION PROJECT

The project's master plan envisions making Four Mile Run into a model of urban ecological restoration through the sustainable integration of a restored natural stream channel with an active urban environment. New tidal wetlands will be created by removing, lowering and terracing the riverside portion of Four Mile Run Park. Aileen Winquist, Arlington County's Watershed Outreach Program Manager will update the ARCA membership on the project.

MIRACLE ON 23RD STREET: Friday, Dec 11, 6pm

The annual Miracle on 23rd Street, presented by Linden Resources at 750 S. 23rd Street, will feature a grand tree lighting ceremony on one of the oldest and tallest spruces in Arlington, Santa arriving on a fire truck, holiday musical entertainment, food from local restaurants and children's activities. AURORA HILLS COMMUNITY CENTER**Renovation Update**

In June 2015 the County held a community meeting to discuss the planned refresh project for the Aurora Hills Community Center. The project is currently in the planning phase with the design phase expected to begin this fall, when meetings with the community to get feedback on the evolving design will be held. Actual construction is not expected to begin until late summer of 2016 and will last a minimum of 8 months when the Center will be closed. The renovations will include new kitchen cabinets, receptionist desk, flooring and new ADA compliant bathrooms. The County is developing a plan to relocate Center programs and classes: options being reviewed include Walter Reed and Gunston Community Centers. The Library will also have some minor infrastructure renovations, but plans to stay open during the work. 22202-NU UPDATE

22202-NU (Neighbors United) is wonderful neighborhood resource that provides free services to those in 22202 to help them stay in their own homes as they age. CARS2GO ON OUR STREETS!

A few cars2go, tiny blue and white car-sharing vehicles, have been spotted recently parked on neighborhood streets designated exclusively for vehicles with parking permits. It turns out that the County has granted cars2go permission to do so as part of a year-long study of "point-to-point" car sharing, where those who become "members" can pick up one of the parked cars, drive it, and then park and abandon it anywhere else in the county without having to feed meters or worry about residential zones. CRYSTAL CITY MULTIMODAL CENTER

Wondering what is happening on 18th & Eads Streets when you walk to the Crystal City Metro? It is part of the Multimodal Center project, which will improve vehicle and pedestrian safety and traffic circulation, and expand bus stop capacity around the Metro station. The first phase of the work is the 18th Street reconstruction, to create new bus bays underneath the bridge, and is expected to last till early 2016.

SECRET SANTA PROGRAM

Last year more than 1,000 needy people received help. ARLINGTON'S COSTUMELAB

The CostumeLab, located at Gunston Middle School and part of Arlington Cultural Affairs, is one of Arlington's original recycling programs. The collection of more than 20,000 costumes and vintage clothing items is used by area performing arts groups and movie and tv productions (lending is limited to qualified groups and not individuals). It's core is primarily 19th and 20th century clothing, donated by Arlington residents, but its staff also creates original pieces, including costumes for Signature Theatre's award winning production of "Passion" which were later lent to the History Channel for its "Lincoln" documentary. SOUTH ARLINGTON WORKING GROUP (SAWG) REPORT TO SCHOOL BOARD

The final report of the SAWG was submitted to the School Board Nov. 5 with the following recommendations: A new neighborhood elementary school to be built on the Thomas Jefferson site; Students from Patrick Henry Elementary will be moved into the new school when it opens in 2019; The Montessori program currently at Drew Model School will be moved to the Patrick Henry building, leaving 400 seats at Drew available for neighborhood use. The report strongly recommends that planning begin for a second elementary school in the Pentagon City area as soon as possible. Report: www.arcaonline.org
