CHRISTIAN DORSEY, FEATURED SPEAKER

We are pleased that Arlington **County Board Member**, **Christian Dorsey**, will be joining us at our Thursday, January 19th membership meeting. He will share with us his goals for the County in 2017. And, as the County's representative on the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments (COG), the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission and WMATA, Christian is uniquely qualified to update us on the present condition and future of our METRO subway system which is a critical component of our 22202 transportation infrastructure.

Moreover, as a former member of the County's Planning Commission, Christian Dorsey is very familiar with the County's procedures for reviewing developer's proposals to construct new, large, high-rise commercial buildings. As the County Board's appointed liaison to monitor development in 22202, we've asked him to address the advisability of broadening the scope of the County's review process to focus not just on one new building at a time but also, more holistically, on each new building's contribution to the overall pressure on the County's infrastructure – particularly transportation and schools – that the eventual build-out of Pentagon and Crystal Cities will create in the years to come. Professionally, Christian is in charge of External and Government Affairs at the highly regarded Economic Policy Institute, a nonpartisan, DC think-tank that conducts economic research and analyzes the impact of various existing and proposed policies and programs on our nation's economy and workforce. He and his wife, Rachael, live in the Columbia Forest neighborhood and their two young children, Jordan and Mila, attend Arlington Public Schools.

Department of Environmental Services **Project Manager**, **John Mir**, will also be on hand to inform us about the County's plan to develop and expand a "personal vehicle parking lot" on County land along **South 31st Street** across from the Water Pollution Control Plant which will involve re-graveling and the installation of temporary lighting. The site was considered as a temporary bus parking lot several years go, when it received vehement opposition from neighbors whose houses overlook the lot.

A NEW HIGH SCHOOL TO OPEN BY SEPT 2022

A new High School Planning Committee was approved by the County Board, with a charge to locate a new high school and to recommend an instructional focus that is designed to "strengthen instructional coherence on a system-wide level while preparing individual students for the future." The committee will begin work in February with a community engagement process that will include review of current programs and options, a community survey, analysis of the options, and in October 2017, staff recommendations to the School Board. SHORT TERM RESIDENTIAL RENTALS ZONING REGULATIONS APPROVED

The County Board approved zoning regulations that define short term residential rentals as a new home occupation called "accessory homestay" and has created standards for this use. The regulations affect short term rentals (less than 30 days) through online services such

as Airbnb, Craigslist, VRBO and others. Board Chair Libby Garvey says "...the decision will help promote positive and safe experiences for renters, rental owners and their neighbors." The new use allows the owner to rent out his/her home for lodging purposes on a short term basis, with regulations to protect the character of the neighborhood; to implement safety requirements to ensure the property complies with zoning, building, fire and other safety codes designed to protect public health, property values and neighborhood character; and provide a mechanism for enforcement should problems arise. Stays are allowed only in units used by the owner as a primary residence, who may host a maximum of 6 lodgers or 2 per bedroom; and does not authorize any commercial use. Owners must obtain a permit for an accessory homestay; so far there is no fee but they may be proposed in the future. ARLINGTON ALERT EMERGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

It's winter, so it follows that there will be emergencies – Metro, snow, heavy rain, downed power lines, traffic pileups, and more. In the past, we had to wait for radio or TV broadcasts or newspapers to find out about them -- now we have **Arlington Alert**, a free service that provides information when major traffic events, mass transit emergencies, and weather alerts happening in Arlington. WPA ERA MURALS AT ARLINGTON'S MAIN POST OFFICE

Have you ever looked up when waiting in line at Arlington's main post office on Washington Boulevard? Next time you are there, check out the seven murals by WPA era artist Auriel Bessemer. Commissioned by the New Deal art officials in 1939/40, the series is Arlington's first public art, and depicts Bessemer's take on local history with images of local Indian tribes, polo at Fort Myer, Robert E. Lee, farm workers

picking tobacco and picnickers at Great Falls. Local historian Toby McIntosh has just written a book on the murals, **Apple Picking**, **Tobacco Harvesting and General Lee**, that can be obtained at www.virginianewdealart.com
