ARLINGTON NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM

Previously Neighborhood Conservation Program

Arlington Ridge has benefited from this program over the years, with support for sidewalks, curbs and gutters, streetlights, signs and park improvements. However, the County felt that the “largesse” from the program was not being distributed evenly to the many civic association areas, so has revamped its program, empowering citizens to identify and plan in their neighborhoods. ARCA proposed providing a sidewalk on a section of S. Kent St. where no sidewalk currently exists, from 18th to 23rd Streets. This stretch of S. Kent Street is frequently cited by residents as being dangerous for pedestrians, many of them Oakridge students going to and from school. It was chosen several years ago to receive a sidewalk after numerous residents reported narrowly avoiding catastrophic collisions with speeding vehicles. This plan has been held up because it requires 60% of homeowners (not renters) to approve the improvement, and some residents are reluctant to do so as they fear they will lose some of their front yard and trees. Unfortunately, without the signatures for the whole stretch, ARCA will move forward with the smaller section of sidewalk from 20th to 23rd St where it has been approved by residents. Tim McIntosh, head of the program, will join us for our March meeting.

ROUTE 1 MULTIMODAL FEASIBILITY STUDY**Route 1 Multimodal Feasibility Study**

In December, the three Civic Associations (ARCA, AHCA and Crystal City) sent a letter to the Virginia Dept. of Transportation listing their concerns about the VDOT plan as did the Arlington County Board, whose comments were similar to those of the civic associations. The County said that they want "to achieve the County's vision for the calming and humanizing of Route 1 into a corridor that is safe and welcoming for all users." This correspondence is available at the Livability22202 website. The VDOT recommendation is to bring Route 1 to grade at 15th and 18th Streets, so the street-wide underpass at 18th would be removed and replaced by a signalized intersection. It will also add a new 10th St. connection between Army-Navy drive and Long Bridge Drive – great for cyclists, drivers and pedestrians. They also recommend reconfiguration of the 23rd Street and Rt. 1 intersection, 25mph maximum speed, no right on red, and something called "Barnes Dance" signalization at 18th Street: (an intersection where traffic halts for a bit so pedestrians can cross in all directions, including diagonally.) Livability22202 also continues to recommend that VDOT collaborate with the community to explore safe crossing options for pedestrians and cyclists at 18th Street, such as a Dutch underpass. This would allow pedestrians and cyclists to easily cross Route 1 regardless of traffic flow and offer a mutually complementary opportunity to create a destination-worthy plaza for shopping and dining by the Metro exit/entrance.

MISSING MIDDLE UPDATE

According to ArlNow, "The Planning Commission voted 7 – 2 to recommend the County Board advertise hearings on a series of

proposed changes to the County's zoning code, which would allow 2 – 8 unit buildings in Arlington's lowest density neighborhoods. The County Board is expected to discuss the request to advertise hearings as early as its meeting on January 21, meaning the proposal could return to the Planning Commission and the County Board for a final vote in March."

COLUMBIA PIKE CLOSURES STARTING JAN. 23

As the Arlington National Cemetery is expanding, there will be significant realignment of both Columbia Pike and S. Joyce Streets, eliminating most of Southgate Road, creating new intersections, sidewalks, bike lanes and a new cross street. The road redevelopment is being planned by the Federal Highway Administration and will have a big impact on our neighborhood as construction begins on its Columbia Pike will be closed between Nash and Joyce. Arlington announced its buildings, streetlights and traffic signals, leased facilities and the Water Pollution control plant and now run on electricity from sustainable sources. The next milestone for the county's Community Energy Plan is powering 100% of electricity with renewal sources by 2035. The Arlington Public Schools continue to expand their solar capacity as well, with new rooftop installations, and so far three elementary schools are considered net-zero in terms of energy use, and more are in the works
