UPDATE ON OAKRIDGE CONCERNS

Over the past several months, parents and community members have expressed concerns regarding declining academic performance and teacher retention issues at Oakridge Elementary. The 3 Civic Associations of 22202 have begun direct engagements with the School Board and APS Staff to understand the long term plan of action for improvements. MOVING THE SPANISH IMMERSION PROGRAM FROM GUNSTON?

The ARCA Board was just as surprised as many of you to learn that the School Board will be voting to move the Middle School Spanish Immersion program from Gunston to Kenmore for the 2025-26 school year. ARCA is concerned about losing a program that is so advantageous to our children. The rationale given is that north Arlington students have to travel too far to get to Gunston; there has been no assessment of the travel time for our neighborhood children to the new location at Kenmore, ARCA continues to advocate for more K-12 seats in 22202, and does not believe continued boundary shifts and relocations are cost effective or good for our community. MISSING MIDDLE APPLICATIONS UPDATE Applications Available online https://www.arlingtonva.us/Government/Progr ams/Building/Permits/EHO/FAQ

Since the first day of accepting applications, Arlington County has so far received 15 permit applications for Missing Middle housing proposals in R-5 and R-6 districts. Applications can be tracked on the County's website. The homes proposed for redevelopment, all "teardowns", are primarily concentrated in or near Metro areas in the central part of the County, mostly along the Rosslyn Ballston corridor. Two are in 22202. Arlingtonians for our Sustainable Future reports that the prices for the new townhouses are 28% higher than the houses they replace. You can follow along on the County's website, which is updated as applications are received.

NATIONAL LANDING BID ANNUAL MEETING

The National Landing Business Improvement District (BID) held its annual meeting on 21 June. Some milestones highlighted were the completion of 570 multi-family units since the beginning of 2022, the new Potomac yard Metro station, and office and retail spaces in Amazon's Met Park. They also noted progress on the multi-modal connection between Crystal City and DCA, and the Virginia Tech Innovation Campus. The BID assessed that the National Landing's development pipeline has produced \$64M of positive net fiscal impacts across County operations, with an additional 57M in years to come

Our Congressional representative Don Beyer has introduced legislation to take federal action to rein in the growing helicopter noise in our neighborhood and elsewhere. The noise is more than a mere nuisance; it is a quality of life issue, shaking homes, disturbing sleep, and can even lead to an increase in cardiovascular disease. The legislation will establish a complaint database to receive, collect and access information.

ArNAC UPDATE ON S. KENT STREET SIDEWALKS

ARCA's plan to build sidewalks on S. Kent Street through the ArNAC (Arlington Neighborhood Advisory Committee) program has been waiting a long time to come to fruition, due to many of the Kent St. owners unwillingness to sign on. Finally it has been approved for one block only (3 blocks were asked for), from 20 – 21st Streets. Despite personal pleas, home visits, lots of paper, that is all that has been approved. 
