STATE & COUNTY ELECTIONS

Voting Day Nov. 7

The November 7 vote is for Arlington County and State office holders, and some constitutional amendments and bond questions. Arlington's 9 Drop boxes left over from the last election will be open till 7pm on election day, access to them begins 10 days before the election: check the website for locations and all election details. Early voting begins Sept. 22; last day to register to vote Oct. 16; last day to apply for a mail ballot Oct. 27.

RIVERHOUSE DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The existing site development includes 3 multifamily buildings with surface parking lots. The development plan will keep the existing buildings, and construct infill development for a total of 3,554 dwelling units and 27,700sq.ft. of retail. The applicant will work with staff to provide the following community benefits: expansion of Virginia Highlands Park; a "green ribbon" throughout the site and an additional 2.5 acres of public space. LYNN ST. ARLINGTON RIDGE RD & 1-395 INTERSECTION

We have waited a long time for this work – it is now underway and we look forward to its completion. Unfortunately the County has not updated the website so we can't give you any more information, such as how long it will take, but we think they mentioned 8 months in a previous letter to us. In the meantime, proceed with caution at the new intersection at S. Lynn Street and Arlington Ridge Road.

SPEED HUMPS PILOT AT GUNSTON

This fall the County will pilot speed humps in "school slow" zones at Gunston: these zones are permanently 20mph on neighborhood streets within 600' of school access. The humps will reduce speeds in the zones where data shows the introduction of the 20mph speed limit has not worked. The humps are easy to install and remove, cost effective, durable and made from 100% recyclable material. They will be installed on Lang Street in the fall, and staff will monitor and collect the data on their effectiveness throughout the winter.

WALKING SCHOOL BUS NEEDS VOLUNTEERS

The Alliance for Senior Programs is looking for more adult volunteers to help lead the walking school buses at elementary schools round the County. The first walking school bus was such a success at Oakridge that they would like to expand around the County. More information at

ARLINGTON HISTORIANS COLLECTING DOCUMENTS FOR LATINO COMMUNITY HISTORY

Arlington's Center for Local History is collecting artifacts to document the rich, vibrant history of the Latino community in Arlington. Between 1990 and 2000, the Latino population increased by 53%, and today makes up 15.7% of it, but the archives did not grow at the same rate. This multi-year collecting initiative, dubbed REAL (Re-Enventro de Arlington Latinos), is looking for materials from people, businesses, civic groups, schools and government. "These archives play a vital role in documenting all voices in a community. Understanding the diverse experiences of everyone is vital to understanding Arlington's history, with four decades of rich community history it is vital to capture this story", says Judy Knudsen at the Library. LIVABILITY REBOOT

Livability22202 is a coalition of our 3 civic associations (Aurora Highlands, ARCA and Crystal City) who face common pressures from rapid commercial and residential development. Community leaders, including our guest Mike Dowell, came together in 2018 to tackle these challenges, creating working groups, workshops and public meetings to draft the Livability22202 Action Plan. Recently Arlington County asked the Crystal and Pentagon Cities Council to prepare a list of the highest priority public amenity projects in the community, and a group of Livability leaders met to evaluate the current framework and draft new recommendations. Mike Dowell was one of the original people spearheading Livability22202 and is a really knowledgeable neighbor who will update us on all this. (many thanks to AHCA president Cory Giacobbe for much of this input).

EHO UPDATE ("MISSING MIDDLE") https://www.arlingtonva.us/Government/Progr ams/Building/Permits/EHO

The County's website gives an extensive overview of the program and even list those who have received permits. It notes that the applicant must obtain zoning approval before a permit is issued; permits do not authorize construction. No more than 58 permits will be issued each calendar year, and it is recommended that applicants meet with the County to determine eligibility. So far only one has been approved in our neighborhood (2612 S. Fern), three are being assessed at 921 S. 22nd; 2108 S. Joyce and 900 S. 20th).

RECLINING LIBERTY

The Museum of Contemporary Art has a eyecatching sculpture on its front lawn at 3550 Wilson Boulevard. The artist responsible is Zaq Landsberg, and it takes its inspiration, he says, from the giant reclining statues of Asia which represent the Buddha on the path to enlightenment. The sculpture was previously in Manhattan, and will be in Arlington till July 2024. The artist says he is asking the viewer to contemplate the status of the ideals the Statue of Liberty represents. The 25 foot statue can be climbed on, leaned on, sat on, and "interacted with". Check it out, you don't have to wait for the museum to be open.

SUGGEST A SCOOTER CORRAL arlingtonva.us/report a problem

No more tripping over those dratted scooters on your sidewalk, now you can suggest a location to receive a scooter corral, through the County's Report a Problem portal on its website at arlingtonva.us. Corrals provide a safe place to park scooters and bicycles, upright out of sidewalks and roadways. Arlington County is installing them throughout neighborhoods, in underutilized street space, like spots too small for parking a car. Suggestions will be reviewed and a determination made for their suitability.
