MEMBERSHIP MEETING AGENDA (Virtual)

ARCA will provide updates on local developments and on the **Livability Reboot** draft priorities, to include the input received at the information session on October 26, a very successful event with over 70 attendees from ARCA, AHCA and Crystal City Civic Associations. We will be asking members to share their thoughts on the updated Livability22202 draft priorities.

Next steps for Livabilty Reboot: **Nov**: Civic Association discussions; **Dec**: Priorities updated to CPCC (Crystal and Pentagon Cities Council) in December meeting, and input forwarded to the County.

Representatives from CPCC and Arlington Advisory Council (ArNAC) will provide local updates to the pending Arlington Neighborhood Kent Street sidewalk.

Please join us and bring suggestions for discussion.

The previously scheduled presentation for November, Virginia Tech, and the Arlington Parks and Recreation will join us at our January 2024 meeting.

RIVERHOUSE UPDATE

The RiverHouse development continues to be refined through the County's Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC) meetings, the third of which will occur on **Thursday, November 16 at 7pm**. The proposed development currently includes 4 new multifamily residences (apartments and condos), senior housing and townhouses, in addition to open space and "green ribbon" connections. **Those interested can also attend the RiverHouse LRPC hybrid meeting on Thursday, Nov. 16 at 7pm and sign up to provide public comment.** https://www.arlingtonva.us/Government/Projects/Project-Types/Site-Plan/RiverHouse

RECAP: LIVABILITY22202 is a coalition of the 3 civic associations of 22202 – Arlington Ridge, Aurora Highlands, and Crystal City – all of whom face common pressures from rapid commercial and residential development. In 2018 community leaders, activists, and interested citizens met to develop holistic strategies, based on shared themes, to create a better, more livable community.

Livability22202 (cont). In 2019 the coalition published an Action Plan and Framework, which have been used by the County, developers and even VDOT in their plans. In June 2023, County staff asked the Crystal and Pentagon Cities Council (CPCC) for a list of community priorities to help prioritize community benefits provided by developer and major projects in Arlington's Capital Improvement Plan. The CPCC, which comprises property owners, residents, and County staff and commission members agreed that the 2019 Livability22202 priorities were the best starting point. Livability22202 leaders met to evaluate the current Framework and draft new recommendations incorporating feedback from the civic associations. The updated priorities have been discussed at the October CPCC meeting, and a community meeting on Oct. 26. https://livability22202.org/livability22202reboot/

MELWOOD UPDATE

The County conducted a Tier2 General Land Use Plan (GLUP) study to evaluate the change in land use designation for the site that is currently occupied by Melwood Horticultural Training Center, and Nelly Custis Park. A request was submitted for the subject properties located on 23rd St.S. between S. Hayes and S. Grant Streets to change the GLUP designation from "Public" to "Low-Medium" Residential. The applicant wants to construct a primarily residential building of 5 stories for its operations and affordable and disabled housing units. The County and neighbors identified concerns in building height, density, building form and scale, transitions, use mix, and impacts on the adjacent park. Share your thoughts on the proposed height scenarios (45' and 60') and other guiding principles. Do we want multi-story buildings on a primarily residential section of 23rd Street and does this set a precedent for future development? Does the "affordable"

The County has achieved its energy intensity reduction goal of 23% since 2009, announced at the White House by Arlington County board member, Christian Dorsev, As a goal achiever, Arlington joins other leading organizations driving portfolio-wide efficiency and emissions innovation on commercial property. STORMWATER UTILITY – A Fairer Way to Bill for Stormwater Services

Environment/Stormwater/Stormwater-Utility-Fee A year ago County voters approved a County proposal to increase stormwater-related funding from \$33million to \$331million. Recent events have put the need for action into sharp focus; monsoon rains in July 2019 overwhelmed the County's stormwater infrastructure, causing millions of dollars in damage to individuals and merchants, and the severity and frequency of rainstorms since 2016 has reinforced the need for climate change. Arlington Civic Federation will discuss the issue at its November meeting, with County staff offering the current state of its remediation efforts and how climate generated threats affect all Arlingtonians.
